STEP ONE: A SPARK

Use the chart given to complete your pre-writing. You will choose a topic, write questions to research, and find at least three sources.



STEP TWO: FUEL FOR THE FIRE

Using the same topic, you will post a rough draft of your report (written or oral) to the discussion board. You also need to read and respond to the posts of others.



STEP THREE: CARRY THE TORCH

Submit the final draft of your report to the assignment link. Look at the grading rubric first to be sure you have included everything.

Choosing a topic

- What makes you tick? Write the answers to four of these questions to find out what you are most curious about.
 - What are the three things that you spend the most time thinking about? Why?
 - If you could live in another time or place, where would you live and why?
 - What are the three most interesting books, articles or magazines you have read? What about them was interesting?
 - What are your three favorite movies or TV shows? What about them interests you?
 - If you could be any person, alive or dead, who would you want to be? Why?
 - What are the three most memorable events of your life? What makes them memorable?
 - You can take any class at any college, what class do you sign up for? Why?
 - What are three situations that make you angry or frustrated? How could you change them?
 - What three topics of conversation must someone be able to engage in to be interesting to you?
- Now choose three topics that are most interesting to you from #1 above. Write out a list of five questions that you are wondering about each topic. These 'research questions' will help you find a topic to write about that you are invested in.

Time to write!

Written Report

- Length 4-6 pages (1000-1600 words)
- MLA formatting
- Works Cited page/Parenthetical citations
- Embedded quotations
- 2-dimentional enhancements (photos, charts, graphs, illustrations, maps, etc)

Oral Report

- Oral Report. Students follow these guidelines: PowerPoint slides 10-20
- Oral presentation length 4-6 minutes
- Verbal parenthetical citations
- Works Cited page (MLA formatting)
- 2 or 3-dimentional enhancements (audio, video, photos, charts, graphs, illustrations, maps, etc)

For BOTH types:

- Add media enhancements to make your presentation interesting.
- Use embedded quotations with MLA citations in your presentation (a minimum of 5).
- Use paraphrased and summarized information with MLA citations.
- Have a Works Cited Page that uses MLA formatting.

Give credit where it's due!

- Quotation marks
- Parenthetical citations
 - DIRECT QUOTES: Mrs. Ritchie commented that fall was her "absolute favorite season" (Smith 94).
 - PARAPHRASED OR SUMMARIZED INFORMATION:
 According to recent reports, Aventa has the best online students in the nation (*The Ritchie Press*).
- Properly formatted Works Cited page
