Editing Your Paper

Fixing the "Little Things" that Make a BIG Difference!





- Editing means making specific surface changes to correct obvious mistakes.
- When you edit, you delete needless words, correct spelling or awkward phrasing, check for complete sentences, and make sure you've correctly punctuated.
- When you revise, you look at conventions.

What Should I Look For?

Punctuation

- Commas, Semi-colons
- End Marks
- Quotation Marks
- Spelling
- Capitalization
- Indenting

- Complete Sentences
 - No run-ons or fragments
- Verb Tense
- Point of View
- Apostrophes
- Subject-Verb Agreement
